## **Business Owner Serves His Community Well!**

**Santa Ana** – Amin David, President of Imperial Products Inc. of Anaheim, CA has been a fixture in Orange County for over 30 years as a business owner, a community leader and now is a commercial property owner in Anaheim. David just acquired his business location of 10 years using the assistance of a U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) loan guarantee.

Imperial Products, Inc. was established in 1990 by David and currently employs 19, including his son D.A. David who manages the company. Imperial Products is a wholesaler of plumbing supplies and an exporter of plumbing repair parts to the construction industry in Mexico. Imperial Products is David's second company. The first, Regal Products Inc. was founded in 1963 as an importer of Mexican paving tiles for the construction industry. When demand for the product began to decline, David used the contacts he made through the years as an importer from Mexico to begin exporting plumbing products.

Amin is very active in the Orange County community. He was one of the founding members of the Hispanic Business & Professionals Association that is currently known as the Orange County Hispanic Chamber of Commerce. He is also a co-founder and unofficial chair/moderator of Los Amigos of Orange County. Los Amigos hosts a weekly breakfast meeting that originated in 1978 to provide then Anaheim Mayor Bill Thom a dialogue with the Hispanic community. Los Amigos is not your typical organization; there are no officers, minutes or by-laws. Anyone may attend and weekly attendance is anywhere from 20 - 75 individuals from all backgrounds, interests and concerns.

Amin is an active member of the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC). LULAC is one of the oldest and largest Hispanic organizations nationally and has historically focused on education, civil rights and employment for Hispanics. He has served on several committees and as a board member for the Orange County Human Relations Commission, Orange County United Way and Concilio of Orange County, an umbrella organization to 25 non-profit agencies in the greater Orange County area.

Amin was recognized October 17, 2002 at the Doubletree Hotel in Ontario by the U.S. Small Business Administration as part of the SBA's salute to Minority Enterprise Development.
