Economic Injury Loans for Small Businesses

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SBA Disaster Loan Deadline is September 9 ***Small business owners still have time to apply***

Albany, NY - The U.S. Small Business Administration reminds small, non-farm and agriculture-dependent businesses located in various counties in New York, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and Vermont that the filing deadline for Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) is September 9.

“A disaster declaration was issued as a result of a similar action taken by the Secretary of Agriculture to help farmers in these states recover from losses caused by severe weather conditions that occurred from April 1, 2003 and continuing,” said SBA Disaster Area Director William E. Leggiero, Jr.

Under this declaration, SBA’s EIDL program is available to small agriculture-dependent businesses and small agricultural cooperatives that suffered economic injury as a direct result of the weather’s effect on agricultural producers. For example, businesses that sell goods and services directly to agricultural producers may be unable to pay bills and/or meet expenses because of the reduced purchasing power of the farmers and ranchers.

Eligible small businesses may qualify for loans up to \$1.5 million. These loans are available at a 3.189 percent interest rate with loan terms up to 30 years. SBA determines eligibility for the program based on the size and type of business and its financial resources.

“SBA does not provide loans to farmers, and cannot provide loans to non-agricultural dependent businesses. Small businesses may contact their local SBA District office for information and other possible assistance. Farmers and ranchers should contact the Farm Services Agency, for information regarding loan programs.” Leggiero added.

The declaration designates Allegany, Cayuga, Columbia, Dutchess, Greene, Herkimer, Jefferson, Lewis, Madison, Niagara, Onondaga, Orange, Oswego, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Schuyler, Seneca, St. Lawrence, Suffolk, Tompkins, Ulster and Wayne counties in the State of New York as the primary disaster area. Small businesses in the contiguous counties of Albany, Cattaraugus, Chenango, Chemung, Cortland, Delaware, Erie, Franklin, Fulton, Genesee, Hamilton, Livingston, Monroe, Montgomery, Nassau, Oneida, Ontario, Orleans, Otsego,

Putnam, Rockland, Schenectady, Steuben, Sullivan, Tioga, Warren, Washington, Wyoming and Yates in the State of New York; Fairfield, Litchfield, Middlesex, New Haven and New London in the State of Connecticut; Berkshire in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; McKean, Pike and Potter in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and Bennington in the State of Vermont are also eligible to apply.
