SBA DECLARATION #R105 -- MILITARY RESERVIST ECONOMIC INJURY DISASTER LOAN PROGRAM

Small businesses employing military reservists may apply for economic injury disaster loans if those employees are called up to active duty during a period of military conflict existing on or after March 24, 1999 and those employees are essential to the success of the small business daily operations. The filing period for small businesses to apply for economic injury loan assistance under the Military Reservist Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program (MREIDL) begins the date the essential employee is ordered to active duty and ends on the date 90 days after the essential employee is discharged or released from active duty.

SBA DECLARATION #9AF1 -- TROPICAL DEPRESSION IVAN

Homeowners, renters, business owners and nonprofit organizations in Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Bedford, Blair, Bradford, Bucks, Butler, Cameron, Carbon, Centre, Chester, Clarion, Clearfield, Clinton, Columbia, Crawford, Cumberland, Dauphin, Delaware, Elk, Franklin, Fulton, Greene, Huntingdon, Indiana, Jefferson, Juniata, Lackawanna, Lawrence, Lebanon, Lehigh, Luzerne, Lycoming, Mifflin, Monroe, Montgomery, Montour, Northampton, Northumberland, Perry, Philadelphia, Pike, Potter, Schuylkill, Snyder, Somerset, Sullivan, Susquehanna, Tioga, Union, Washington, Wayne, Westmoreland, Wyoming and York counties in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania are eligible to apply for an SBA disaster loan to cover physical losses resulting from Tropical Depression Ivan that occurred September 17 and continued through October 1. Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) are available to small businesses located in the primary counties, as well as the contiguous counties of Adams, Berks, Cambria, Erie, Fayette, Forest, Lancaster, McKean, Mercer, Venango and Warren in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; New Castle in the State of Delaware; Allegany, Baltimore, Carroll, Cecil, Frederick, Garrett, Harford and Washington in the State of Maryland; Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, Hunterdon, Mercer, Sussex and Warren in the State of New Jersey; Allegany, Broome, Chemung, Delaware, Orange, Steuben, Sullivan and Tioga in the State of New York; Ashtabula, Columbiana, Mahoning and Trumbull in the State of Ohio; and Brooke, Hancock, Marshall, Monongalia, Ohio and Wetzel in the State of West Virginia. However, to be eligible for consideration under the SBA disaster program, losses sustained must be the result of Tropical Depression Ivan.

The deadline for filing Physical loan applications is November 18, 2004.

The deadline for filing EIDLs is June 20, 2005.

SBA DECLARATION #9ZN9 -- SEVERE STORMS AND FLOODING

Homeowners, renters, business owners and nonprofit organizations in Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia counties in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania are eligible to apply for an SBA disaster loan to cover physical losses resulting from the severe storms and flooding that occurred July 27 through August 25, 2004. Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) are

available to small businesses located in the primary counties, as well as the contiguous counties of Berks, Bucks, Chester and Lehigh in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; New Castle in the State of Delaware; and Burlington, Camden and Gloucester in the State of New Jersey. However, to be eligible for consideration under the SBA disaster program, losses sustained must be the result of the severe storms and flooding.

The deadline for filing Physical loan applications is December 8, 2004.

The deadline for filing EIDLs is May 6, 2005.

SBA DECLARATION #3600/9ZM9 — FLOODING

Homeowners, renters, business owners and nonprofit organizations in the primary County of Cecil in the State of Maryland, as well as the contiguous counties of Harford and Kent in the State of Maryland; New Castle in the State of Delaware; and Chester and Lancaster in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania are eligible to apply for an SBA disaster loan to cover physical losses resulting from flooding that occurred on July 12 and 13, 2004. Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) are available to small businesses located in the primary county, as well as the contiguous counties. However, to be eligible for consideration under the SBA disaster program, losses sustained must be the result of the flooding that occurred on July 12 and 13.

The deadline for filing Physical loan applications expired September 21, 2004.

The deadline for filing EIDLs is April 25, 2005.
