Comments:

Graded Agency:

In FY 2010, the Department of the Interior (DOI) exceeded its negotiated goals in all categories except small business prime contracting and SDVOSB. This was due to the Recovery Act workload, which put a premium on timely awards and the use of blanket purchase agreements to meet the obligation deadline. In 2010, we awarded \$2.2 billion in contracts to small businesses as compared to the 2009 level of \$1.7 billion. For FY 2011, the DOI will include small business contracting goals in the performance plans of senior executives who oversee the acquisition workforce.

The DOI submitted a corrective action plan to the SBA on January 28, 2011, addressing the reasons that the 2010 Small Business (SB) prime and SDVOSB goals were not met. As part of its plan, DOI has planned to participate in more than 35 separate outreach and training events and the Deputy Secretary will participate in two outreach events during FY 2011. The DOI's efforts include continued communication with high level senior executives and program managers that are responsible for making acquisition decisions, acquisition staffs and small business specialists. The DOI has begun to collect stories about small business successes for posting on the OMB MAX System and is working to increase the awareness of contracting opportunities available to small businesses under GSA schedules. The DOI has targeted strategic plans for three unmet socio-economic program goals, including SB prime and the Service-Disabled Veterans program.

The DOI continues to demonstrate its commitment to expand possible subcontracting opportunities for small businesses. DOI has processes in place to conduct internal reviews to identify best SB Program practices. In addition, compliance by the bureaus and offices with small business subcontracting plans and goals is monitored and enforced by Contracting Officers and Small Business Specialists. The Acquisition Screening and Review Form was revised and updated during FY 2010 to include subcontracting and will be closely reviewed prior to solicitation.

DOI also continues to demonstrate its commitment to small business utilization through regular training of acquisition staff on procedures, policies, and regulations that impacts the SB Program.

SBA:

The Department of the Interior (DOI) met 3 of its 5 prime contracting goals: Women Owned Small Business, Small Disadvantaged Business and HUBZone. However, it did not meet its prime contracting goals for Small Business and Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business.

Fiscal year 2010 prime contracting achievement saw increases over FY2009 in Women Owned Small Business. DOI FY2010 achievement declined for Small Business, Small Disadvantaged Business, Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business and HUBZone.

DOI regularly attends Small Business Procurement Advisory Council meetings.
