Graded Agency:

The Department of Justice remains committed to ensuring that small businesses including small disadvantaged businesses, woman-owned small businesses, HUBZone firms, and small businesses owned by service disabled veterans play a vital role in the Department satisfying its mission as prime contractors and subcontractors. During FY 2010, the Department increased its prime contracting accomplishments in every small business category. The Department also realizes that sustaining this level of accomplishments will be difficult given the number of large requirements that are outside of the capability of small businesses as prime contractors. As a result, subcontracting will remain an important part of the Department's acquisition plans. In FY 2010, DOJ exceeded its subcontracting goals for small businesses in four out of 5 categories.

DOJ looks forward to working collaboratively with the small business community and with the SBA as we strive to meet or exceed all of our small business goals.

SBA:

The Department of Justice (DOJ) met 2 of its 5 prime contracting goals: Women Owned Small Business and Small Disadvantaged Business. However, it did not meet its prime contracting goals for Small Business, Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business and HUBZone.

Fiscal year 2010 prime contracting achievement saw increases over FY2009 in all categories: Small Business, Women Owned Small Business, Small Disadvantaged Business, Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business and HUBZone.

DOJ regularly attends Small Business Procurement Advisory Council meetings.
