## Graded Agency:

The Department is honored to receive recognition for its leadership in developing innovative strategies and programs to ensure small business concerns receive a fair share of our acquisitions. The Department is especially proud of its strategic sourcing initiatives which were all 100% set-aside for small businesses and will yield approximately \$37 million in spend annually. DOC also implemented a reverse auction platform to drive savings and increase small business participation under the simplified acquisition threshold (SAT) for commodities. This resulted in a 93% set-aside rate and 8% savings for requirements purchased through reverse auction. The Department has expanded its use of reverse auction to include simple services under the SAT. DOC's overall achievement is a testament to its commitment to the small business community and its leadership.
