## Graded Agency:

The Environmental Protection Agency's "A" rating on the FY 2014 Small Business Scorecard can be directly attributed to the unwavering support of senior leadership within the Agency; a close, collaborative relationship with the Office of Acquisition Management; and the clear, consistent communication of the Agency's goals, training of our acquisition professionals, and the outreach efforts to the small business community provided by the Office of Small Business Programs. In FY 2014, the Agency faced the challenge of meeting an ambitious 42.15% small business goal...a challenge we did not meet, but we are very proud of our efforts that yielded 40.72% of our eligible contract dollars to small businesses. In FY 2015, the Agency's small business contracting goal is an attainable 40%. While we maintain the efforts and initiatives that have been successful, the Agency will continue to implement initiatives targeted at meeting the HUBZone goal in FY 2015.
