
Small Disadvantaged Business FY2019 Prime Contracting

Small business is expanding and contributing to the economy at a record-breaking level. By better competing for and winning federal contracts, small businesses have supported about 677,000 jobs, driving job creation, innovation, and growth on a local, regional, and national level.



- Educates small businesses on business development, federal contracting, and certification programs.
- Provides business assistance to small disadvantaged businesses, including:
 - Evaluate/assist in readiness to enter federal marketplace
 - Application to 8(a) Business Development Program
 - Marketing/responding to opportunities

Advocating for Small Business

Socially and economically disadvantaged businesses often qualify for the SBA 8(a) Business Development Program. In FY 2019, the SBA set an agency priority goal to increase the percentage of unique 8(a) contracts awarded to SDBs.

These SDBs receive tailored business development assistance through Business Opportunity Specialists in SBA's 68 district offices and the network of Procurement Technical Assistance Centers, found through SBA.gov/LocalAssistance.

FY2019 Highlights

- Federal government exceeded small business contracting goals for the seventh consecutive year.
- Awarded record-breaking \$132.9 billion in prime contracts to small business.
- Small Disadvantaged Businesses received \$51.6 billion (historic high); could equate to over 266,000 jobs.
- Over 23,000 SDB prime contractors (representing 32% of small business vendors) received average \$2.5 million award per prime contractor

SBA Certifications

A business can further gain access to contracting opportunities by seeking certification with other SBA programs:

- Historically Underutilized Business Zone (HUBZone)
- Woman-Owned or Economically Disadvantaged Woman-Owned Small Business
- Veteran owned or Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned.

The SBA offers the 7(j) Management and Technical Assistance program, helping eligible small businesses with training, executive education, and consulting in a broad range of business disciplines.
