
Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business FY2021Prime Contracting

Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Businesses (SDVOSBs) are expanding and contributing to the economy at a record-breaking level. By competing for and winning federal contracts, SDVOSBs have supported over 130K jobs, driving job creation, innovation, and economic growth on a local, regional, and national level.



Outreach Efforts

SBA continued outreach on certification programs and education on federal contracting to veteran population through Veteran Business Opportunity Centers, veteranfocused events, and social media.

Advocating for Small Business

- SBA recently lessened the regulatory burden on veteran- business owners by consolidating ownershipand control requirements into one regulation. (SBA Final Rule 83 FR 48908)
 - Lessened requirement that a service-disabled veteran (SDV) make all decisions.
 - Defines "extraordinary circumstances" in whicha non-SDV can have shared decision-making authority.
 - Established that control could shift when the veteran is called to active duty.
 - Surviving spouse can own and control 100% of the SDVOSB for up to 10 years after the veteran's death.

FY2021 Highlights

- The federal government exceeded the small business contracting goal for the ninth consecutive year.
- The government awarded a recordbreaking \$154.2* billion in prime contracts to small business.
- More than \$22.0* billion in contracts were awarded to Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned small businesses, which equates to over 130K jobs.
- Prime contracts were awarded to over
 5,400 SDVOSBs over 8% total small business vendors.
- Average award of \$4.0 million per SDOSB prime contractor.



As required by the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) of 2021, VA's Center for Verification and Evaluation (CVE) will be transferred to SBA effective January 1, 2023.
