
Woman-Owned Small Business FY2021 Prime Contracting

Woman-Owned Small Businesses (WOSBs) are expanding and contributing to the economy at a record-breaking level. By competing for and winning federal contracts, women-owned small businesses have supported about 132K jobs, driving job creation, innovation, and economic growth on a local, regional, and national level.



Outreach efforts

- SBA continues to promote certification programs and educate woman-owned small businesses on federal contracting.
- SBA partners with Women Impacting Public Policy and American Express on initiatives like ChallengeHER.
 - Boosts contracting opportunities for woman-owned small businesses.
 - Beginning its 10th year, ChallengeHER has educated 24,500+ women entrepreneurs.

Advocating for Small Business

FY2021 Highlights

- The Federal government exceeded the small business contracting goal for the ninth consecutive year.
- Awarded a record-breaking \$154.2*
 billion in prime contracts to small business.
- Achieved 4.63%* eligible contracting spending to WOSBs.
- \$26 billion awards to woman-owned small businesses, which equates to about 132K jobs.
- Prime contracts awarded to over
 13,300 WOSB prime contractors
 20% of total small business vendors.
- Average award of \$2 million per WOSB prime contractor.
