
Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Businesses FY2022 Prime Contracting



In Fiscal Year 2022, the government made strides in creating expanded contracting opportunities for Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Businesses (SDVOSBs), including:

- The federal government far exceeded its 3% SDVOSB goal for FY2022, having awarded 4.57% (or \$28.1 billion dollars) to these businesses this fiscal year. In addition to surpassing its goal, these figures represent a record high for SDVOSBs in federal contracting.
- As required by the NDAA for FY21, SBA implemented a new certification system for SDVOSBs as part of the
 migration of Veteran-owned business certification from the Veterans Administration (VA) to SBA on January 1,
 2023. Having all contracting certification programs under one roof will allow Veteran-owned firms and SDVOSBs
 benefit from reciprocity with other SBA programs like 8(a), HUBZone, and the WOSB program.
- OMB issued new guidance granting agencies automatic "credit" under category management for all awards given to socioeconomic small businesses.
