# Fiscal Year 2022 Small Business Procurement Scorecard

Grade Calculation Methodology

July 2023

# Methodology

In Section 868 of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) of 2016 (P.L. 114-92), Congress directed SBA to change its scorecard methodology for FY 2017. Specifically, Congress directed that an agency's performance towards its prime contracting goals shall account for 50 percent of an agency's grade. Further, Congress directed that the remaining 50 percent should be weighted in a manner determined by the Administrator of the SBA to include subcontracting and the number of small business prime contractors in the five small business categories across a spectrum of North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes.

In addition, Section 1692 of the NDAA of 2013 (P.L. 112-239) amended Section 7104(b) of the Federal Acquisition Streamlining Act of 1994 (P.L. 103-355) to provide that the Small Business Procurement Advisory Council shall conduct reviews of each Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization (OSDBU) to determine the office's compliance with Section 15(k) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 644(k)).

SBA is continuing prior years' weighting methodology (FY20-FY22) for the FY 2022 Scorecard calculations to assess how well federal agencies reach their small business and socio-economic prime contracting and subcontracting goals, to examine the number of small business prime contractors, to review the agencies compliance with Section 15(k) requirements of the Small Business Act, retaining the checklist 22 requirements from FY 2021. For the FY22 scorecard, each OSDBU director was required to provide a response to each of the 22 requirements. The answers were included in the grade calculation.

Each agency's Scorecard grade consists of its achievements in these four areas, and each area is weighted by the percentage shown below:

Areas	% Grade
Prime Contracting Achievement	50% of Scorecard Grade
Subcontracting Achievement	20% of Scorecard Grade
OSDBU Peer Review on Agency Compliance with Section 15(k) of the Small Business Act (22 requirements)	20% of Scorecard Grade
Comparison of the Number of Small Business Prime Contractors in each of the Five Small Business Categories Between FY 2021 and FY 2022	10% of Scorecard Grade

### **Methodology (continued 1)**

The prime and subcontracting component goals include goals for small businesses, small businesses owned by women (WOSB), small disadvantaged businesses (SDB), service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses (SDVOSB), and small businesses located in Historically Underutilized Business Zones (HUBZones).

The prime vendor comparison goal is the result of the number small business concerns, including small business concerns under various socioeconomic categories, regarding prime contracts awarded in the current fiscal year compared to the prior fiscal year and scored based on the following scale:

- Increase in number of SB primes by 10% or more = 1.3
- ➤ Increase in number of SB primes by 5% or more but less than or equal to 10% = 1.2
- Increase in number of SB primes between 0% and less than 5% = 1.1
- ➤ No change in the number of SB primes (Change = 0%) 0% increase/decrease (no change) = 1.0
- Decrease in number of SB primes by more than 0% but less than 5% = 0.9
- Decrease in number of SB primes by 5% or more but less than or equal to 10% = 0.8
- Decrease in number of SB primes by 10% or more = 0.7

The OSDBU peer review consists of scoring a written response from agencies using a detailed compliance checklist for 22 requirements in 15 U.S.C. 644(k) using the following scale for each question:

Excellent = 1.0 Unsatisfactory = 0.0

Section 15(k)(1) is allowed partial credit of 0.5 with appropriate explanation and documentation provided



## **Methodology (continued 2)**

Each federal agency has a different small business and small disadvantaged business contracting goal, established annually in consultation with SBA. SBA ensured that the sum total of all of the goals exceeds the 23% target established by law for small business and the 11% target in OMB Memorandum M-22-13 for small disadvantaged business.

Based on their overall performance, SBA assigned each agency a letter grade from six potential grades (A+, A, B, C, D, F). These grades provide additional information on comparison of performance levels among different agencies.

In FY 2022, in accordance with federal law, agencies received double credit for prime contract awards awarded as local area set asides in support of a disaster. 15 USC § 644(f). Additionally, agencies received double credit for awards to small businesses located in Puerto Rico and U.S. territories, if the award did not already qualify for double credit under the disaster provision. 15 U.S.C. § 644(x). Double credit means that the small business, SDB, WOSB, SDVOSB, and HUBZone dollars were doubled for those awards, without doubling the denominator for that award.

Starting in the Scorecard for FY 2022, SBA excluded certain transactions that, if included in the Scorecard, would present a distorted view of the opportunities for small businesses to participate in government contracts with Federal agencies. Specifically, SBA excluded deobligations that are associated with prime contracts for which there are no current positive dollar awards. SBA explained its methodology in a June 22, 2022 Federal Register notice. The deobligations methodology also is described on SAM.gov.
