

Advocacy Comments on the Designation of Critical Habitat For Nine Bexar County, Texas, Invertebrates

On April 4, 2011 the Office of Advocacy (Advocacy) filed public comments with the Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) in response to the Designation of Critical Habitat for Nine Bexar County, Texas, Invertebrates. A copy of Advocacy's comments may be viewed at www.sba.gov/advo/laws/comments.

- On February 22, 2011, FWS published a proposed rule to designation critical habitat for nine Bexar County, Texas, invertebrates. FWS is proposing approximately 6,906 acres as critical habitat.
- Advocacy has submitted comment reflecting its concern that FWS has not complied with its obligations under the Regulatory Flexibility Act by publishing an Initial Regulatory Flexibility Analysis or certifying that the rule will not have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of small businesses.
