**Comments:****Graded Agency:**

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) continues to support agency mission goals and objectives to regulate commercial and institutional uses of nuclear materials through Federal contracting. The NRC also continues to support our Nation's small businesses, including those small businesses owned by the disadvantaged, women, veterans, service-disabled veterans and those located in Historically Underutilized Business Zones (HUBZone) across the country. The NRC is committed to increasing its efforts to achieve Federal small business contract-related goals and objectives, and supports varied Federal, Congressional, State and local government efforts and initiatives to maximize small business prime and subcontract opportunities. The NRC continues to deliver a viable "outreach" program to train, counsel and assist the business community. The NRC recognizes that small businesses are the economic engine that drive job growth and are vital to the economic recovery and security of the Nation. The NRC also values future small business partnerships in supporting agency operations to ensure that our agency benefits from a flexible, competitive and innovative supplier base.

While the NRC did fall slightly short in meeting its overall small business prime contracting goal, the agency is pleased to report that contract dollars awarded to both woman-owned and service-disabled veteran-owned businesses increased. In fact, the NRC achieved the best performance to date in service-disabled veteran-owned small business contracting. The NRC continues to support and implement a Scorecard Progress Plan to increase the value of prime and subcontract awards to small business through strategic acquisition planning, market research and set-aside efforts as well as by providing training, counseling and technical assistance to both Federal agency officials and the business community. The NRC currently is engaging in efforts to increase expectations and oversight of its small business subcontracting program, including prime contractor subcontract performance and reporting. Moreover, as the agency moves towards strategic acquisition and agency operational modernization efforts, it stands prepared to ensure a place for small business in any future consolidation efforts.

**SBA:**

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) met 3 of its 5 prime contracting goals: Women Owned Small Business, Small Disadvantaged Business and HUBZone. However, it did not meet its prime contracting goals for Small Business and Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business.

Fiscal year 2010 prime contracting achievement saw increases over FY2009 in Women Owned Small Business, and Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business. NRC FY2010 achievement declined for Small Business, Small Disadvantaged Business and HUBZone.

NRC regularly attends Small Business Procurement Advisory Council meetings.
