The Department of Justice (DOJ) is fully committed to the nation's small businesses including small disadvantaged businesses (SDB), women-owned small businesses (WOSB), service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses (SDVOSB), and firms certified through the HUBZone Program (HUBZone). DOJ's leadership and its employees are proud that we exceeded our small business prime contracting goal of 29.23% by awarding 32.45% of our prime contracting dollars to American small businesses in FY 2014, which equates to more than \$2 billion. We are also proud that we exceeded our prime contracting goals for SDBs, WOSBs, and SDVOSBs and that we awarded our highest dollar total in the last ten years to HUBZone firms.

The Department recognizes the vital role that small businesses have not only in the delivery of our complex law enforcement and litigation related missions, but also in job creation and in our national economy.
