



Boots to Business: Reboot is an entrepreneurial education program offered to veterans by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) in partnership with the Institute for Veterans and Military Families at Syracuse University (IVMF).

The curriculum provides valuable assistance to veterans exploring self-employment opportunities by leading them through the key steps for evaluating business concepts and the foundational knowledge required for developing a business plan.

Participants are also introduced to SBA resources available to help access start-up capital and additional technical assistance.

TWO-PART PROGRAM

INTRODUCTION TO ENTREPRENEURSHIP ONE-DAY COURSE

It is a one-day course, and is instructor-led by subject matter experts from the SBA, SBA resource partners and entrepreneurship professionals. Participants learn business fundamentals and work through an initial feasibility analysis of their business concepts.

FOUNDATIONS OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP COURSE:

Upon completion of Introduction to Entrepreneurship class, participants can elect to further their study through an instructor guided eight-week online course led by the IVMF at Syracuse University. Completion of this course requires approximately 10 hours of study each week to guide participants through the fundamentals of developing a business plan.

After completing Boots to Business: Reboot, participants will have the tools and knowledge they need to identify a business opportunity, draft a business plan, and launch their enterprise.
