Graded Agency:

The overall small business accomplishment is comparatively significant but fell short of the established goal. This shortcoming can be attributed primarily to the Agency's annual spend rate vs. the annually recurring large business contracts that support the infrastructure of mission critical activities. To overcome this shortcoming, we will continue to focus on small business to meet the Agency's acquisition needs and will evaluate available options when the large infrastructure contracts are re-competed. We are extremely pleased to have successfully achieved/exceeded the socio-economic goals and will place greater emphasis on monitoring compliance and achievement of the subcontracting goals.

SBA:

Goaling Achievement

The Small Business Administration (SBA) met 4 of their 5 prime contracting goals missing Small Business.

Fiscal year 2009 prime contracting achievement saw increases over FY2008 in Small Disadvantaged Business and Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business. SBA FY2009 achievement declined from FY2008 in Small Business, Women Owned Small Business and HUBZone.

SBA Data Anomaly Reports

SBA responded late to SBA's contracting data anomaly report but fully addressed submitted anomalies.

Partnership with SBA

SBA's Director of the Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization (OSDBU) regularly attended the SBA chaired Small Business Procurement Advisory Council meetings hosted at the SBA.

The SBA contributes to the Interagency Task Force on Federal Contracting Opportunities for Small Businesses acting as both an executive committee chair and workgroup co-chair member.

American Reinvestment and Recovery Act Contracts

Since enactment of ARRA, the SBA has directed 90.9% of their Recovery Act funds toward small businesses.
