Graded Agency:

DOJ's FY 2009 Small Business Prime Contracting Goal (36.8%) was based on our FY 2006 accomplishments and was not consistent with the types of services we procured in FY 2009. We began seeing the trend toward different and more complex mission support contracts back in FY 2006 and requested that SBA reduce our overall small business prime contracting goal accordingly. Our FY 2010 Small Business Prime Contracting Goal is 31%.

Because of increased mission support requirements, DOJ's FY 2009 procurement obligations of almost \$8 Billion were the highest in DOJ's history. The Department's \$1.9 Billion in obligations to small business were also the highest in our history, but only represented 24.54% of our procurement obligations. This small business percentage did not meet our assigned goal because, based on market research, many of our requirements were beyond the capability of small businesses. Moreover, because of technical and/or program management requirements, as well as limitations on subcontracting, these procurements were not suitable for full or partial small business set-asides. Some examples include:

- Two 10-Year requirements to manage and operate Criminal Alien Detention Facilities for 4,000 Alien inmates each.
- Five-Year Contracts across the country for Comprehensive Medical Services for Federal Prisoners. These services can only be provided by hospitals, which are "other than small businesses".
- A five-year contract for Translation, Transcription, Monitoring, and Interception for various DOJ field divisions.

Although these contracts and many others were beyond the capability of small businesses, they should and did result in significant subcontracting opportunities for small businesses. As a result, DOJ attained its highest small business subcontracting accomplishments ever in FY 2009—46.47%. Although we anticipate that this trend toward more complex contracts will continue in future years, DOJ will continue to make every possible effort to ensure that small businesses have the maximum practicable opportunity to participate as DOJ prime contractors.

SBA:

Goaling Achievement

The Department of Justice (DOJ) met 1 of their 5 prime contracting goals missing Small Business, Women Owned Small Business, Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business and HUBZone.

Fiscal year 2009 prime contracting achievement saw an increase over FY2008 in Small Disadvantaged Business. DOJ FY2009 achievement declined for Small Business, Women Owned Small Business, Service-Disable Veteran Owned Small Business, and HUBZone.

SBA Data Anomaly Reports

DOJ responded on-time to SBA's contracting data anomaly report and partially addressed submitted anomalies.

Partnership with SBA

DOJ regularly attended the SBA chaired Small Business Procurement Advisory Council meetings hosted at the SBA.

American Reinvestment and Recovery Act Contracts

Since enactment of ARRA, DOJ has directed 56.3% of their Recovery Act funds toward small businesses.
